### TASTING NOTES

Bursting aromas of black cherry, brambleberry and Mission fig with alluring secondary hints of leather, cinnamon, cedar, rosemary and thyme. The palate showcases a beautiful balance between juicy, ripe red and black fruit and complex layers of vanilla bean, roasted coffee and baking spice. Medium to full bodied wine with rooted structure and dusty tannins to age 5-8 years or enjoy now.
